WHAT IS THE ILLINOIS VICTIM ASSISTANCE ACADEMY (IVAA)?

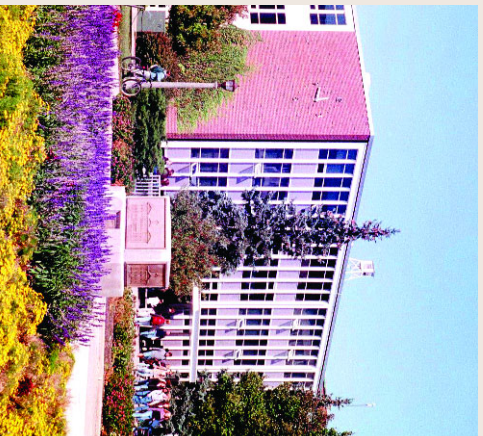
The IVAA is a week-long, intensive course of study for crime victim service providers and law enforcement personnel. The IVAA is designed to improve the quality and consistency of victim services in Illinois. Through education, the IVAA builds the capacity of providers and law enforcement to serve those victimized by crime, and encourages cutting-edge thinking about the ways we can help victims regain control of their lives.

THE GOALS OF THE IVAA ARE TO:

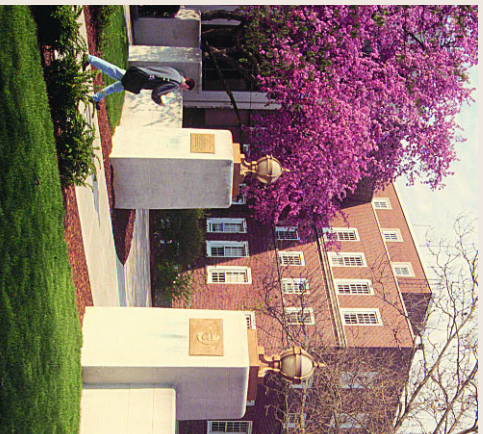
- Provide comprehensive, multidisciplinary training to victim service providers and allied professionals throughout Illinois;
